JACKSON DOWNTOWN STORMWATER STUDY PROJECT

To all interested citizens of [Jackson/Breathitt County](#) , Kentucky:

The City of Jackson is applying for federal and state grants to do a public infrastructure project to include a Stormwater Study located downtown in Breathitt County, Jackson KY. This project is to improve storm water management in the downtown and lakeside areas of Jackson. The study will identify the water sheds and calculate potential flows. It will also identify and evaluate existing storm water infrastructure, and recommend and design a comprehensive plan for the proposed water management areas. The engineering firm will work directly with the city of Jackson to gather study information, determine problem areas, and creation of solutions.

The City of Jackson is applying for up to \$4,881,000 in Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds for the project.

At least 51% of the proposed CDBG-DR funding will benefit low-to-moderate (LMI) persons. It is anticipated the percentage will be higher but the goal is at minimum to meet 51%.

The City of Jackson has successfully utilized CDBG funding in the past for infrastructure and economic development projects. Specific information regarding these projects can be provided upon request.

### Comments on Project/Application

A public hearing was held on February 13, 2024 at the Jackson City Hall. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain views on housing and community development needs, review proposed activities, review the proposed application, and solicit public comments. Technical assistance is available to help groups representing low- and moderate-income persons in developing proposals. No comments were made regarding the project. A copy of the CDBG-DR application material will be on file at Kentucky River Area Development District and Jackson City Hall for citizens' review and comment during regular business hours from 8:00 AM Through 4:00 PM. Comments on the proposed project/application may be submitted to the attention of Lisa Napier from **June 3, 2024** until the close of business on **June 17, 2024**.
